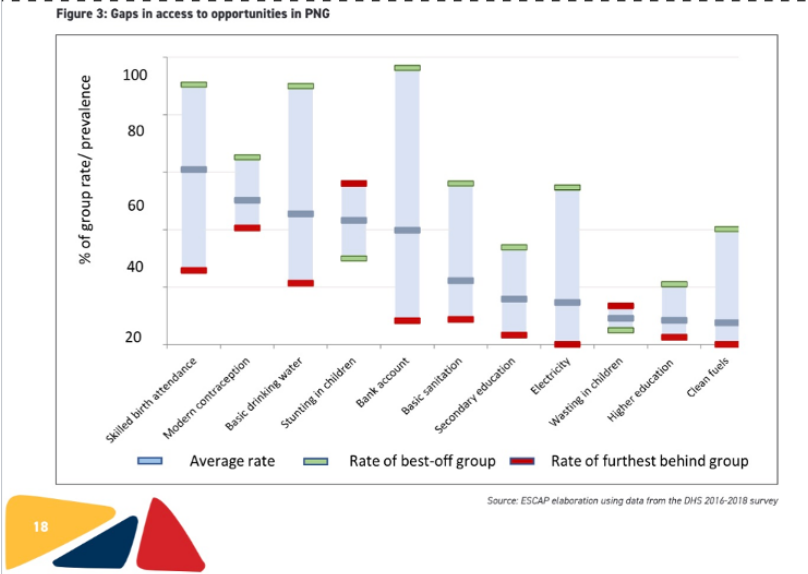

After discussion with our counterparts in Turkmenistan, we realized this data was available in the MICS 2019 report for Turkmenistan and were able to run and refine the analysis.
