Birth registration (SDG 16.9.1) is a key building inclusive of component societies and providing legal identity for all. Literacy (SDG 4.6.1) and ICT skills (SDG 4.4.1) pave the way for lifelong learning and digital connectivity.

Adding them further expands our repository of education indicators. We invite you to explore the details and embrace the possibilities that these new indicators bring to strengthen the evidence base of inequality of opportunities.
